Fourteen ambassadors from Louisville enjoyed a Friday morning at the symphony; a Sunday afternoon Cardinal baseball game; attended home-hosted dinner; rode to the top of the arch; visited Cahokia Mounds; and enjoyed other activities planned for them.

Stopover Exchange from Limberg, Belgium –July 13 to July 17 – Maureen McGrath, Exchange Director.

Four members of the Belgium Club did a three-night stay in St. Louis. They attended mass at the St. Louis Basilica Cathedral, followed by lunch at the Feasting Fox. They took a backstage tour of the zoo and had lunch at Grant's Farm. Their last day included a tour of the Missouri Botanical Garden and saying farewell to Club members at the Club picnic.
